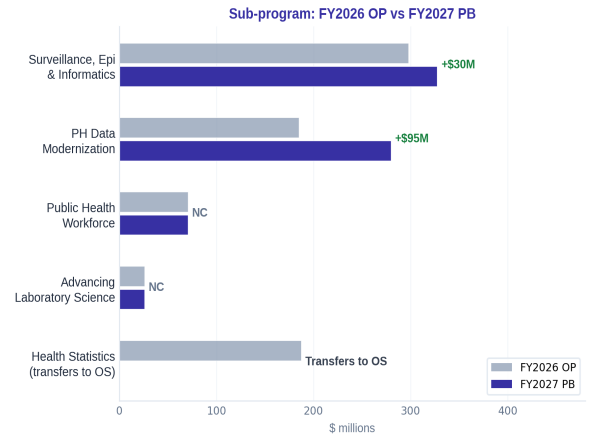
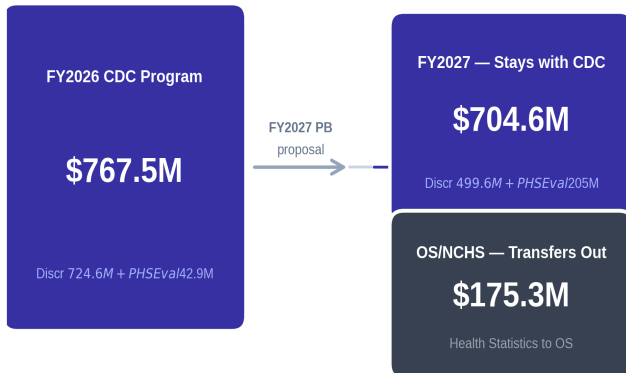

## SUMMARY

The FY2027 President's Budget restructures Public Health Scientific Services, resulting in a combined funding increase of \$112.4M (+14.6%) across all programs when the OS/NCHS transfer is included. Within PHSS (retained at CDC), Public Health Data Modernization increases substantially from \$185.0M to \$280.0M — driven by a new \$205.0M PHS Evaluation transfer, offset by a \$110M reduction in discretionary funding. Surveillance, Epidemiology, and Informatics increases by \$29.5M to \$327.6M. Advancing Laboratory Science (\$26.0M) and Public Health Workforce (\$71.0M) are unchanged. Health Statistics (\$187.4M) transfers out of PHSS to the Office of the Secretary as the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) at a reduced level of \$175.3M. The PHSS budget line declines from \$767.5M to \$704.6M due entirely to this transfer; no retained CDC programs are eliminated or reduced.
